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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	DR. RITCHIE: So let's call the meeting
3	to order on time. It looks like we have enough people
4	here, and so let's start with a roll call, please.
5	MS. ROBERTSON: Melissa Robertson,
6	Office of Superintendent of Insurance.
7	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. Do we have
8	usually
9	MS. LUERA: I can do it, Dr. Ritchie.
10	DR. RITCHIE: Yeah? Okay. I don't
11	have it in front of me.
12	MS. ROBERTSON: I think Debbie has it.
13	DR. RITCHIE: Yeah. Debbie usually
14	does
15	MS. LEURA: Chairman Ritchie?
16	DR. RITCHIE: Present.
17	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I don't know
18	when they're going to call me.
19	MS. LEURA: Vicechair Love?
20	MS. LOVE: Present.
21	MS. LEURA: Mr. Clark?
22	MR. CLARK: Present.
23	MS. LEURA: Mr. Autio?
24	MR. AUTIO: Present.
25	MS. LEURA: Mr. Dekleva?

4	MS. LEURA: Ms. Starace?

7	And Mr. Vargas?
8	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. I think we have a
9	quorum. Therefore, onto the next item, approval of
10	agenda. Do I hear a move to approve the agenda?
11	MR. AUTIO: I move to approve the
12	agenda.
13	DR. RITCHIE: Second?
14	MS. LOVE: Second. This is Kathy Love.
15	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you. Any
16	discussion, addition, subtractions? Okay. Any
17	objection to then the approval of the agenda? All
18	right. Hearing none, the agenda is approved.
19	Next, the approval of minutes from the
20	last meeting which was Wednesday September 11, 2024.
21	Do I hear a motion on the minutes from September 11th?
22	MR. CLARK: This is Troy Clark. So
23	moved.
24	MR. AUTIO: This is Nick Autio.
25	Second.

1	DR. RITCHIE: Any discussion? All
2	right. Hearing none, any objection to approval of the
3	minutes? Okay. Minutes are therefore approved.
4	On to item number 2, discussion
5	regarding evidence presented during the surcharge rate
6	hearing. Okay. So before we get to the actual
7	subcommittee's recommendations or written report, is
8	there any discussion regarding the evidence that we
9	had available and that we want to comment on now
10	before looking at the report?
11	All right. Hearing none
12	MR. CLARK: Actually, Mr. Chair, this
13	is Troy Clark. Just one quick clarification. At the
14	last meeting where we received the addendum that had
15	the exhibits for the calculations excluding the batch
16	provision, did that get included in the did that
17	get admitted in as an exhibit? I couldn't recall if
18	it did or not.
19	Because I believe our recommendations
20	come from that, so we need to make sure that those two
21	pages got included with the rest of the report.
22	MR. WARD: This is Vince. I can speak
23	to this.
24	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you. Yes, sir.
25	MR. WARD: So that exhibit was attached
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1	to the record. So if out just an abundance of this
2	isn't noticed as a hearing, this meeting, so my view
3	is that that summary document has been admitted into
4	the record and it's something that you all can rely on
5	for your recommendation.
6	MR. CLARK: Perfect. Thanks, Vince.
7	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you. Thank you for
8	the clarification. Any other discussion?
9	All right. Proceeding on to item
10	number 3, the advisory board's recommendation decision
11	regarding the 2025 surcharge rates.
12	So I'd like someone from the
13	subcommittee to present the recommendation report.
14	Please just real briefly, you know, what was decided
15	especially since a lot of people didn't have a chance
16	to look at this except for a few minutes.
17	MR. AUTIO: Ray or Mike, you want to
18	take it? Or I'm happy to do it also. Whatever you
19	prefer.
20	MR. VARGAS: Nick, since I'm on the
21	phone, I'd ask that you do it.
22	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. No problem.
23	MR. VARGAS: Thank you.
24	MR. AUTIO: So this is Nick Autio, for
25	the record. We had a subcommittee of three members:

1	Mike Dekleva, Ray Vargas, and myself. And I want to
2	thank Ray first for taking the lead on drafting these
3	proposed findings, conclusions, and recommendations.
4	The entire subcommittee had a chance to
5	review, offered some brief revisions, and we agreed on
6	all the language that is in the report that I hope is
7	in front of everyone. I hope everyone has had a
8	chance to review.
9	First, you know, walking through really
LO	paragraphs 1 to 8 of the report, a lot of that is
L1	really focused on, you know, the law surrounding the
L2	advisory board and what our duties are as an advisory
L3	board throughout this surcharge rate setting process.
L4	So that's just really a recitation of what occurred.
L5	And then as you'll see in paragraph 8
L6	there, there's a brief discussion regarding
L7	Mr. Walling's report that was prepared and admitted
L8	into evidence at the surcharge rate hearing. And
L9	we've also kind of set forth the data sources that
20	Pinnacle relied on in paragraph 9 there.
21	Next, because, you know, a large focus
22	of what we do here is on ensuring the solvency of the
23	fund, we had a discussion of the deficit. We've
24	highlighted the fact that the independent
25	practitioner's deficit has fully been paid off.

1	And then we looked at, you know,
2	between the actuary analysis and the report we
3	received on December 31st of 2022 and in the
4	subsequent report, which is the report that we heard
5	evidence on as part of this rate setting process. We
6	went through a brief history of what has happened with
7	the deficit, and you'll see that in paragraphs 10 to
8	17 of the draft.
9	And then we really concluded there that
10	the fund's deficit position as of December 31, 2023,
11	was estimated to be \$73.6 million, which is consistent
12	with the evidence that was presented to us.
13	It should be noted that that fund
14	deficit of 73.6 million is a decrease of 22 million
15	since the prior analysis that was finalized by the
16	actuary on December 31st of 2022. So although the
17	deficit is still
18	MS. CHRISTOFFERSON: I found this one
19	for 30 bucks, ships for 30 bucks.
20	DR. RITCHIE: I'm sorry. Please mute
21	yourself if you haven't already.
22	MR. AUTIO: So, you know, still a
23	substantial deficit, but we are making improvements.
24	Next we moved into a discussion that was focused on
25	future risk.

1	We started that discussion in paragraph
2	18 by looking at the statutorily mandated adjustment
3	for CPI that's applicable to independent physicians
4	and surgeons. We went through a discussion of that
5	CPI increase in a manner that's consistent with the
6	evidence we received.
7	And then we also had a similar
8	discussions of the CPI adjustment that's applicable to
9	the independent outpatient healthcare facilities.
10	Once again, those are the numbers taken directly from
11	the actuarial report that was provided by Pinnacle.
12	Next, we went into a discussion
13	regarding the allocation of the deficit between the
14	independent physicians and the hospitals. That can be
15	seen from paragraph 21 going down to paragraph
16	well, 27 arguably and really looking at, you know,
17	what's happened with the deficit allocation there.
18	And then, you know, in that same
19	subsection, we begin discussing, you know, the actual
20	surcharge rates that are going to be set.
21	As you'll see in paragraph 21, because
22	there isn't any deficit surcharge for independent
23	physicians and surgeons and really the independent
24	practitioners overall in the fund, there's the
25	proposed increase of 8.6 percent that was agreed upon

1	by the board. That's for independent surgeons and
2	physicians.
3	Now, that 8.6 percent is at an expected
4	level. If there's a 75 percent confidence level
5	applied, that would be 17.9 percent.
6	And then in paragraph 22, we have
7	discussed, you know, the ongoing process of basically
8	charging an additional 10 percent of the collective
9	surcharge from any practice and having that be the
LO	entity surcharge which has been occurring for some
L1	time, so nothing's changed with that.
L2	Next, we go into focusing on the
L3	hospitals. As I mentioned before and as can be seen
L4	in paragraph 23, \$52.4 million of the deficit has been
L5	allocated to hospitals.
L6	After that, we go into in paragraph 24
L7	looking at proposed deficit surcharges for the
L8	hospitals. It'd be 19.7 percent at an expected level
L9	and 29.8 percent at a 75 percent confidence level.
20	Those are numbers taken directly from Pinnacle's
21	report.
22	Moving on, you know, we continued to,
23	you know, discuss in both paragraphs from 25 to 27, we
24	continued to discuss, you know, potential surcharges
25	and then also the class assignment changes that we

heard evidence on from Pinnacle and that were
documented at page 21 of Pinnacle's report.
Mr. Vargas was handy enough to include
the actual table from Pinnacle's report in paragraph
25 regarding those different class assignments.
And then in paragraph 28 we moved on to
discussing the independent outpatient healthcare
facilities. As everyone might recall in the prior
policy period, we basically treated outpatient
healthcare facilities as we treat other entities, just
basically doing a surcharge based on 10 percent of the
collective surcharge of all of the employee and
qualified healthcare providers in that entity.
Pinnacle has recommended that we change
that approach. We had an extensive discussion of that
both during the hearing and after the hearing. And in
paragraph 28 you can see a breakdown of the new
independent outpatient healthcare facility rates, and
we've also included a table there that was taken
directly from Pinnacle's report.
And so after going through all of the
evidence that was presented to us and that is in the
record, we've used that evidence to reach several
findings. Those findings can be found from page 5 to
page 6 of the report.

1	First and most importantly well, not
2	most importantly in the conclusions, but just
3	addressing the conclusions themselves is pursuant to
4	the votes that were taken during our previous hearing,
5	the board in this report if accepted by the board
6	would be recommending an increase of 8.6 percent for
7	surcharges for independent providers that are
8	qualified under the act.
9	For hospitals we're recommending the
10	accepted rate increase proposed by the actuary at an
11	expected level, which would be 19.7 percent, and that
12	would include the deficit surcharge. So just to be
13	clear, that's both, you know, dealing with the
14	underlying surcharge but then also the surcharge for
15	their deficit reduction. So that would be a 19.7
16	increase for hospitals.
17	We have recommended keeping the, you
18	know, independent, you know, provider-owned entities,
19	keeping them at that assessed 10 percent of
20	accumulative individual QHP surcharges for those QHPs
21	who are with another practice.
22	And then we have also adopted the class
23	assignment changes that were recommended by the
24	actuary. That can be seen in subparagraph D.
25	And then lastly as we've discussed and
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1	heard evidence on, we have in subparagraph E we
2	have suggested adopting the actuary's recommendations
3	regarding surcharge rates for independent outpatient
4	healthcare facilities.
5	And we've actually to simplify things
6	and to keep things as accurate as possible, we have
7	just really copied and pasted the table that was
8	provided by Pinnacle in its report regarding those
9	surcharge rates for the independent outpatient
10	healthcare facilities.
11	Lastly, and based on a discussion that
12	the board had and voted on, we in paragraph F have
13	recommended that the PCF shall keep data on a per
14	procedure basis as it does for hospitals, you know,
15	for use in determining future surcharges for
16	independent outpatient healthcare facilities. So
17	that's the last recommendation included in the draft
18	report.
19	Once again, just want to thank
20	Mr. Vargas for putting together this report, and I'm
21	sure if anyone has any questions, one of the members
22	of the subcommittee can hopefully answer them. Are
23	there any questions on it?
24	MR. VARGAS: Mr. Autio, Chairman
25	Ritchie, this is Ray Vargas. I just want to add a

1	couple of things. One is that we have two blanks for
2	the exhibits in paragraphs 3 and 8, and that's just
3	because I didn't have written down what was what
4	exhibits were admitted. So if Ms. Luera could help us
5	fill those in, I'd appreciate it.
6	And in reviewing this prior to the
7	meeting today, I noticed that we have a blank
8	paragraph number 29 we just need to delete.
9	DR. RITCHIE: Right. I see that.
10	Okay. Then when we vote on this, we'll vote on it
11	with those edits. But any further discussion,
12	questions about the report, please?
13	MS. STARACE: This is Carmela. I have
14	a question, and I'm sorry. I am an attorney, but
15	basically I just draft wills, so I'm the patient
16	representative and I have questions concerning
17	paragraphs 10 through 17.
18	DR. RITCHIE: Go ahead.
19	MS. STARACE: So it looks like there
20	was on paragraph 17, it says there was a decrease
21	in 22 million since the prior analysis in the deficit,
22	but above that it says that 32 million came from the
23	legislature.
24	So it really feels to me like a \$10,000
25	deficit a \$10 million deficit because we got 32
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1	million from the taxpayers, but we still have this
2	and we only gained 22 million back from the deficit.
3	So I'm wondering does the proposals
4	anticipate that there will be more legislative
5	assistance or is this based on going forward without
6	having to go to the legislature?
7	MR. AUTIO: This is Nick Autio. I'm
8	happy to take a stab at that. My understanding is
9	that the proposed surcharge rate increases set forth
10	in the draft report are not accounting for any further
11	legislative infusion. So these recommended surcharge
12	increases are made on the assumption that we will not
13	be receiving any further legislative infusion.
14	MS. STARACE: Okay. Thank you so much.
15	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you for that. Any
16	other questions, corrections about this report or
17	other input?
18	MS. LUERA: Hi. This is Debbie Luera.
19	I would just request if the board agrees to do so, on
20	page 5 under the recommendations for B for hospitals,
21	it would be helpful just to break out what the actuary
22	recommended for a surcharge increase or decrease and
23	then another percentage for the deficit repayment.
24	Just because when we are putting in the
25	new surcharges for the carriers, we take the surcharge

1	increase decrease first and then we multiply that
2	based on the factor for the deficit reductions. So I
3	think just for clarity and ease I guess selfishly on
4	my part, it would be easier to have both of those
5	numbers spelled out in the recommendation.
6	MR. CLARK: So Ms. Luera, this is Troy
7	Clark. Are you asking us to just break the pieces out
8	in the verbiage to say a minus 5.7 percent I guess
9	would be a reduction as opposed to an increase on the
10	base level with a whatever that difference is on the
11	math? I think it's 28.6 percent increase or surcharge
12	for the deficit for the total of 19.7. You just want
13	to see the three parts?
14	MS. LUERA: Yes, please. That would be
15	really helpful.
16	MR. CLARK: I'm fine with that if the
17	rest of the committee is.
18	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you. I wondered
19	about that, breaking that down. So thank you for
20	clarifying that, Ms. Luera. That makes it simpler and
21	cleaner for rate setting, et cetera. I agree
22	wholeheartedly.
23	But are there any objections to that or
24	further comments on that? We need to amend the report
25	to say that. Do we have the actual math, then, to put

1	in this? Is that correct, Mr. Clark, Mr. Vargas,
2	Mr. Autio? We want to be accurate
3	MR. CLARK: This is Mr. Clark. I just
4	pulled up the schedule. The numbers are for the base
5	rate in this case a decrease of 5.7 percent and a
6	surcharge of 26.8 percent combined for an overall 19.7
7	percent increase. That comes straight from Exhibit 6
8	page 1 which was the supplemental exhibit I referred
9	to earlier provided by Mr. Walling.
10	DR. RITCHIE: And I would propose that
11	we put in that reference as well into the report of
12	where that comes from.
13	MS. LOVE: Nick, are you acting as the
14	scribe on this?
15	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. You said Exhibit 6,
16	Troy?
17	MR. CLARK: It says the exhibit is
18	titled let me get back to it to make sure I read it
19	right. Yeah. For hospitals, it is Exhibit 6 page 1
20	which was the second page of the two additional pages
21	that he provided without the batch.
22	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. And so just to be
23	very clear on your request, Ms. Luera, you would like
24	us to include that breakdown really of how we come up
25	with the 19.7 percent increase. You would like us to

1	include that breakdown in paragraph B on page 5?
2	MS. LUERA: Yes, please.
3	MR. AUTIO: Okay.
4	MS. LUERA: I believe that's how it was
5	done in previous years. Don't quote me on that, but
6	it just makes it easier for us when we're having to do
7	the calculations to set the new surcharges, provided,
8	you know, the superintendent accepts your
9	recommendation.
10	MR. CLARK: Since the minutes are to
11	transcription, you will be quoted on that, just FYI.
12	MS. LUERA: Yes.
13	MR. AUTIO: I don't have any objection
14	to making that change at all.
15	DR. RITCHIE: And we could just include
16	that table too like we've done other tables, this
17	table from Exhibit 6 because it's very straightforward
18	in there.
19	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. I mean, we could
20	take a screenshot of that and insert it also.
21	Would that work for you, Ms. Luera?
22	MS. LUERA: Sure. That would be great.
23	Thanks.
24	MR. AUTIO: Okay. We will do that if
25	there's no objection.

1	DR. RITCHIE: Yeah. Any objection to
2	that from the committee, the board? Hearing none,
3	let's then edit it. Make that edit to it. Any
4	other anything else from the board as far as edits
5	to this report?
6	MS. STARACE: This is Carmela again.
7	I'm not trying to beat a dead horse. I just want to
8	talk about the deficit section one more time to say
9	one other thing because I think that the percentage
LO	increase is large, but I support it and I think it's
L1	the right thing to do.
L2	And I think paragraph 17 could be a
L3	little misleading because it says in the last sentence
L4	"This is a decrease of 22 million since the prior
L5	analysis." I feel like that sentence should have a
L6	comma at the end of it and say "but that deficit was
L7	paid down in part by the 32 million that we had from
L8	the legislation."
L9	Because I think people could read this
20	and think why do we need, you know, such a high
21	surcharge increase when it's going down anyway?
22	And if the subcommittee is saying these
23	decisions are not based on anticipating future
24	legislative gifts or appropriations, then I think that
25	anybody any layperson reading this should be able

1	to read 17 and not say, "But look, it's going down.
2	We don't need an increase this high."
3	_
	DR. RITCHIE: Any comment from the
4	MR. VARGAS: Ray Vargas
5	DR. RITCHIE: Yeah, Mr. Vargas?
6	MR. VARGAS: Yeah. And I guess my only
7	comment is we don't have Mr. Walling here to ask him
8	if that number included the legislative infusion or
9	didn't include the legislative infusion.
10	I understood him to tell us that that
11	was a decrease irrespective of the legislative
12	infusion, but again without him here, I'm not sure.
13	So we just took the data from his report.
14	MS. STARACE: Right. And I understand.
15	If we don't know, we can't put it in a final draft. I
16	was just going off paragraph 13 which said "inclusive
17	of the 32.5 million."
18	DR. RITCHIE: A point, Mr. Vargas,
19	Mr. Clark, since the infusions effectively put the
20	deficit due to private practice positions et cetera,
21	the entire deficit is based on the hospital deficit
22	currently.
23	And therefore, the changes are not
24	inclusive of the legislative infusion because we're
25	just dealing with the hospital deficit which was not

1	affected by that.
2	MR. AUTIO: And this is Nick Autio just
3	to I guess give my thoughts on the issues. I tend to
4	agree with Mr. Vargas. We tried very carefully in
5	drafting this report to really just rely on what
6	information, what evidence we had received from the
7	actuary.
8	You know, and the actuary very
9	specifically discussed this \$2 million decrease we're
10	discussing. And that can be found at page 2 of the
11	actuarial report.
12	And I do hear the concern regarding
13	I mean, of all people I hear the concern regarding,
14	you know, the increases that hospitals and physicians
15	are going to be seeing.
16	But at the same time, although we have
17	seen that \$22 million reduction, you know, there still
18	is an estimated \$73.6 million deficit as of December
19	31st of 2023. So progress is good but, you know,
20	there's still a significant deficit.
21	So I'm comfortable with that, and if
22	people have questions as to why there is an increase,
23	I think, you know, that can be answered by looking at
24	paragraph 16.
25	MR. CLARK: Mr. Chair, this is

1	MS. STARACE: I appreciate it.
2	MR. CLARK: This is Troy. I might be
3	able to add one more item. And since I'm only working
4	on one screen I'm not in the office today. I have
5	not looked for it, but I feel confident that Mr. Autio
6	did give the correct answer.
7	I asked a similar question for a
8	different reason, Carmela, in the transcript. So I'd
9	have to go back and find it in the transcript, but I
10	specifically asked the actuary if the infusion of
11	dollars was included in the calculations and the
12	deficit repayments were including the calculations.
13	Because I asked on a basis of a concern
14	that if he include the deficit repayment from last
15	year from the hospitals, the way his math worked on
16	the calculations of his estimates for the current
17	years that that would overstate the need.
18	And he was very clear to say the
19	deficit reduction both from the legislative infusion
20	and from the hospitals was excluded from the model.
21	So I feel very confident that the same question was
22	answered from a different question that I had asked
23	and Mr. Autio is representing that correctly.
24	MS. LOVE: And I think you're
25	MS. STARACE: Thank you, Troy. I

1	actually now do remember you asking that. So I
2	appreciate everybody giving me some education on this.
3	MR. CLARK: Not a problem. It's
4	almost
5	MS. LOVE: Also you're doing better
6	than the federal government, so good for you. Our
7	debt's smaller than that.
8	MR. MARTINEZ: This is Mr. Martinez. I
9	think probably what we could add to that statement for
10	Carmela is that there is a need for them to have a
11	zero balance with the hospital deficit by the year
12	2027, and that's why the rates are increasing because
13	we do have to get that solvent by that time when the
14	hospitals leave the fund.
15	MR. CLARK: Just to clarify on that,
16	Mr. Martinez, I believe it's 2026, by the end of 2026.
17	MR. MARTINEZ: Okay. I think by 2027,
18	so yeah, at the end of '26.
19	MR. AUTIO: And this is Nick Autio.
20	And we've included that statement in paragraph
21	well, in paragraph 7, subsection B.
22	So, you know, if people are reading
23	this report in that level of detail, they will see
24	that very exact statement that Mr. Vargas quoted from
25	41.5.25 F regarding the need to pay down the

1	hospital's deficit by the end of 2026. So we've got
2	that in the report.
3	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. Any other
4	comments? Okay. So we have before us an edited
5	report. Is anyone unclear on the edits we've made
6	today?
7	MR. CLARK: Mr. Chair, this is Troy.
8	I'm prepared to make a motion to accept it with the
9	changes, but I want to make sure because I do that
10	that Carmela's comfortable or if there is still in her
11	opinion need to modify paragraph 17 in any way before
12	I make that motion.
13	MS. STARACE: No. And I reread it
14	again, and I think that it's pretty clear that that
15	96,000 debt is inclusive of the legislative
16	appropriation. So that I just I don't think I
17	read that as it was written, so I hope I didn't take
18	us on a wild goose chase.
19	MR. CLARK: Not at all.
20	DR. RITCHIE: No, not at all.
21	MR. CLARK: If you're comfortable,
22	then, Mr. Chair this is Troy Clark I would make
23	a motion that we accept the report as drafted with the
24	modifications that we have noted for alteration, which
25	I believe are the insertion of the two exhibit

1	numbers, letters to complete the ranges; and the
2	removal of paragraph 29; and then the insertion of the
3	chart I'm trying to flip back and forth here, so
4	bear with me on paragraph well, I guess it's
5	letter B on page 5 that we're going to include the
6	chart which shows the breakdown of the 19.7 percent
7	into its two components of the minus 5.7 percent and
8	the 26.8 percent resulting in the 19.7 percent. I
9	apologize for that being a novel of a motion.
10	DR. RITCHIE: And I have that down as
11	the Exhibit 6 of the addendum. Is that the same
12	chart?
13	MR. CLARK: Exhibit 6 is the reference
14	that we were going to I think include as a screenshot
15	for that last paragraph B. I think Nick Autio was
16	going to be making the was going to be scribing
17	these changes. We just can't see his screen to see
18	it, so I've tried to verbalize all of those.
19	DR. RITCHIE: You comfortable with
20	that, Nick?
21	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. Yeah. I will make
22	all of those changes and I will send it to Ms. Luera
23	with all board members copied if that is acceptable to
24	everyone else. But I would also ask Ms. Luera just to
25	send me those exhibits letters and/or numbers,

1	whichever it is.
2	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. So then let's hold
3	that vote now, but I'm going to ask Mr. Ward about
4	going forward since we have not seen this in writing,
5	is there anything that we need to do to further verify
6	that or not?
7	MR. WARD: Given the nature of the
8	changes, I'm comfortable with the board acting based
9	on the motion as accepted and not having to reconvene
10	another meeting to look at those edits.
11	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you.
12	MR. WARD: Does that make sense?
13	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you. Yes.
14	Okay. So I've heard the motion. I
15	don't think I've heard a second yet.
16	MR. MARTINEZ: I'll officially second
17	that.
18	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you, Mr. Martinez.
19	So let us have a roll call vote,
20	please. Ms. Luera?
21	MS. ROMERO: I can do that for you.
22	Dr. Ritchie, do you approve?
23	DR. RITCHIE: Approve.
24	MS. ROMERO: Vicechair Love?
25	MS. LOVE: Approved.
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1	MS. ROMERO: Mr. Clark?
2	MR. CLARK: Approve.
3	MS. ROMERO: Mr. Autio?
4	MR. AUTIO: Approved.
5	MS. ROMERO: Mr. Dekleva?
6	MR. DEKLEVA: Approve.
7	MS. ROMERO: Mr. Martinez?
8	MR. MARTINEZ: Approved.
9	MS. ROMERO: Ms. Stevens?
10	Mr. Vargas?
11	MR. VARGAS: Approved.
12	MS. ROMERO: And Ms. Starace?
13	MS. STARACE: Approved.
14	MS. ROMERO: I do see Ms. Stevens
15	online, but I didn't hear her for the record.
16	Ms. Stevens?
17	MS. STEVENS: Can you hear me now?
18	MS. ROMERO: Yes, ma'am.
19	MS. STEVENS: Okay. Yeah, approved.
20	MS. ROMERO: Thank you.
21	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you, Ms. Romero.
22	Appreciate that. Okay. Therefore Yes, sir?
23	MR. CLARK: Mr. Autio, I just forwarded
24	the e-mail that has the full report plus the extra
25	file. It has Exhibit 6 in it to you.
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1	MR. AUTIO: Perfect. Thank you. I was
2	actually just searching my e-mail for it, so I
3	appreciate that, Troy.
4	MS. LUERA: Mr. Autio, I looked at the
5	transcript of the rate hearing. We had Exhibits A and
6	B, so there were just the two exhibits and Exhibit B
7	is the actuarial study.
8	MR. AUTIO: And was Exhibit A the CV of
9	Mr. Walling?
10	MS. LUERA: Yes, it was.
11	MR. AUTIO: Okay. Great. Thanks.
12	DR. RITCHIE: Excellent.
13	MS. LUERA: You're welcome.
14	DR. RITCHIE: Excellent. Excellent.
15	Okay. So it sounds like we're ready to move on to
16	item 4, discussion of process to prepare the report to
17	the legislature, our last order of business for this
18	year's items.
19	So in the past we have put together
20	another committee or had the same committee do this
21	and meet and have this ready by end of December,
22	beginning of January to be ready for the first day of
23	the legislature.
24	Mr. Ward, am I correct in that or have
25	I misspoken?

1	MR. WARD: No. You're right. We have
2	to get this legislative report done, and I think
3	typically we've met in early January. I would propose
4	if possible meeting a little earlier since we've
5	completed the report sooner than usual.
6	DR. RITCHIE: Excellent. We're getting
7	better at this. This is good. So I totally agree
8	with that. Does anyone have any objection to that or
9	comments? Then how about beginning of December or we
10	could even do it in November since we have this done.
11	MS. LOVE: I'd prefer early December.
12	DR. RITCHIE: Ms. Love, okay. I think,
13	say, the first week of December. How does that look
14	for people?
15	MR. CLARK: I will be out of the
16	country until the 8th of December.
17	DR. RITCHIE: All right. Hopefully
18	somewhere good.
19	MR. CLARK: Hopefully.
20	DR. RITCHIE: Hopefully.
21	MS. LOVE: How about the 9th? Well, so
22	first of all, is the purpose of the meeting in
23	December just help me remember is when we will
24	discuss the items that we want to include in the
25	report and then a committee will convene and then
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1	introduce the report or propose a report to the group,
2	and then we'll approve it in early January?
3	DR. RITCHIE: I believe that is what
4	we've done in the past.
5	MR. WARD: I believe that's correct.
6	MR. CLARK: I believe that's happened.
7	As Mr. Ward has mentioned that we're done with the
8	report early, Mr. Chair, would it be possible that we
9	name a subcommittee to draft that report and present
10	it to us as a board on the 9th of December?
11	That would everybody's schedules
12	just get so busy from Thanksgiving holiday through the
13	end of the year through, you know, January 2nd or 3rd.
14	And I'd even volunteer if I need to be
15	on that committee to help draft it to report it by
16	then, I can do such. But I'm not sure what the rest
17	of the board's feelings are, but it would nice not to
18	have to meet twice in December is what I'm trying to
19	avoid.
20	DR. RITCHIE: Precisely. Concur. Any
21	other discussion?
22	Yes, Ms. Love?
23	MS. LOVE: I am happy to help draft it.
24	And I'm looking at November since Troy will be out,
25	and I could do November 19th if that would work for
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1	anybody else in the afternoon.
2	DR. RITCHIE: So do
3	MR. CLARK: Is that for a subcommittee
4	gathering? Is that what you're speaking of, Ms. Love?
5	MS. LOVE: Well, I was thinking for
6	if you want to try to just put together a committee to
7	draft the report and then present it to the group, we
8	could present it to the group on the 19th.
9	MR. CLARK: And then making edits and
10	finalize
11	MS. LOVE: But if I'm hearing you
12	correctly, it sounds like we're trying to condense the
13	process a bit.
14	DR. RITCHIE: I think there's
15	MR. CLARK: I'm okay with that. It
16	sounds like you're suggesting that we meet on the
17	19th, get the input from the board
18	DR. RITCHIE: For the subcommittee.
19	MR. CLARK: I'm sorry, for this
20	subcommittee, present the draft to the board, and then
21	work through any edits to finalize on December 9th?
22	MS. LOVE: Well, that's fine too.
23	That's actually not what I was proposing, but that's
24	fine.
25	MR. CLARK: Oh.

1	MS. LOVE: I mean, does everybody feel
2	like we need to have two meetings around this? Do we
3	need to meet to talk about what goes in the report and
4	then have a committee put the report together and then
5	meet again to talk about what is in the report and if
6	we like it and change it? Or can we skip that first
7	meeting and put the subcommittee together?
8	We kind of have I mean, I know last
9	year we had some dispute about, you know,
10	philosophical perspectives about what belongs in this
11	report. I assume that we will have that
12	representation on the committee to discuss that.
13	But otherwise, in terms of the report
14	to the legislature just like with the, you know, we're
15	getting better with the process with the rate
16	recommendations, hopefully we're getting better with
17	the report to the legislature.
18	And so I was kind of proposing we put
19	the committee together, draft the report, and then
20	come together and hash it out.
21	MR. CLARK: That was my original
22	thought, so I would prefer that.
23	MR. DEKLEVA: And this is Mike
24	Dekleva
25	MR. WARD: And can I just jump in?
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1	MR. DEKLEVA: I'm sorry. Go ahead.
2	MR. WARD: I'm sorry. Can I just jump
3	in really quick?
4	DR. RITCHIE: Yes, Mr. Ward.
5	MR. WARD: I just I want to say that
6	I'm fine with that approach. I just want to remind
7	everybody about the significance of avoiding a rolling
8	quorum, and I think that when you have the two
9	meetings, I think that it potentially reduces the
10	likelihood of a rolling quorum.
11	So I think if the committee's going to
12	meet before, I think the subcommittee needs to be very
13	diligent about ensuring that you're only talking
14	amongst yourselves since there isn't a quorum of that
15	group.
16	And what that means is that maybe
17	there's a little less certainty as to what the group
18	may think, you know, when you meet after the
19	subcommittee meeting.
20	So I'm fine with the approach. I just
21	want to caution everybody about the rolling quorum
22	requirement.
23	DR. RITCHIE: I appreciate that.
24	MR. CLARK: Mr. Ward, this is Troy
25	Clark again. Let me ask and see: Would it be
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1	acceptable if that subcommittee group meets and
2	this is not a knock on anything about the work that
3	was done for today because I appreciate everybody, but
4	if we send out to the entire board that draft ahead of
5	that meeting on December 9th to the entire board, that
6	should avoid a rolling quorum issue; right?
7	So everybody else gets to see it and
8	has time to review it in more than enough time coming
9	to that December 9th meeting.
LO	MR. WARD: Well, the bigger the
L1	rolling quorum would mean that when you circulate it,
L2	there shouldn't be any communication about the draft
L3	of that report that would indicate any decisions being
L4	made.
L5	So I'm happy if it's it's fine if
L6	it's circulated. It's fine if it's reviewed. I think
L7	that helps people prepare for the meeting on the 9th.
L8	But the important point is we can't
L9	have, like, e-mails going back and forth among each
20	other with certain agreements or let's do this or
21	let's do that prior to the meeting on the 9th.
22	MR. CLARK: Understood. And my thought
23	was ahead of time meeting like a normal agenda where
24	you have three or four days to review it as opposed to
25	a very short period of time.

1	MR. WARD: But you're not suggesting
2	two meetings. Are you? You're not suggesting two
3	full meetings, though; right?
4	MR. CLARK: No.
5	MR. WARD: Yeah. So my advice is the
6	same. I'm okay with the approach. We just the
7	subcommittee needs to remain separate and apart from
8	the full board, and it should refrain from engaging in
9	any substantive communications that could be construed
10	as an agreement about the content of that report prior
11	to the meeting on the 9th.
12	MS. LOVE: I think that warning is very
13	well taken, Vince. Thank you for that. It's a good
14	reminder.
15	MR. CLARK: Yeah. I agree.
16	MS. LOVE: On anything this board does,
17	we have to be careful not to create side agreements.
18	MR. DEKLEVA: And this is Mike Dekleva.
19	I'm just going to say that I agree with the plan that
20	Kathy has put together.
21	You know, the subcommittee can draft
22	the report, circulate it, maybe even with an express
23	statement in the e-mail saying here's a copy of the
24	draft report. Please do not, you know, discuss prior
25	to the meeting. Then we have the meeting. The 19th
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1	of November's fine for me, by the way.
2	And I don't know if there was a third
3	member of the committee. I think Troy said he would
4	do it, Kathy said she would do it. Maybe Chairman
5	Ritchie or Nick could be the third member.
6	But I just wanted to get on the record
7	that I'm in favor of doing it in a way that Kathy Love
8	presented.
9	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. This is Nick Autio.
10	I'm happy to volunteer for the committee, and the
11	process that's been discussed seems to make sense to
12	me.
13	DR. RITCHIE: And Mr. Ward, the maximum
14	size of that committee is three as I recall so as not
15	to violate the quorum?
16	MR. WARD: So I'm a lawyer because I
17	don't do math, but as long as we don't have a majority
18	of folks that would constitute a quorum, we're fine.
19	MR. AUTIO: So we could have up to
20	four, then, because it's a nine-person board.
21	MS. LOVE: So I would propose that
22	we sorry. I was going to propose this is Kathy.
23	I would propose that we add a patient representative
24	to this since we've got a hospital medical society,

1	MR. AUTIO: Makes good sense to me.
2	MR. CLARK: I concur. It would be
3	great to have Carmela or Ellen join, even though we
4	have people have experience, they make it quicker and
5	faster, they may give a good insight like Carmela's
6	questions were that we might want to highlight to the
7	legislation legislators. I'm sorry.
8	MS. LOVE: Carmela, are you willing to
9	do it?
10	DR. RITCHIE: Yes.
11	MS. STARACE: I'd be happy to.
12	MS. LOVE: Thank you.
13	DR. RITCHIE: Excellent. All right.
14	Are there any objections to the people who volunteered
15	for this, to the makeup of that subcommittee?
16	Okay. Then we are looking at the
17	meeting being November 19th to go over the
18	recommendations of that subcommittee, the report of
19	that subcommittee with presumably obtaining the
20	results of that subcommittee by the end of the week
21	before. Does anyone have an objection or problem with
22	November 19th? It's a Tuesday.
23	MR. CLARK: Do we have a proposed time,
24	Mr. Chair?
25	DR. RITCHIE: I would like to do it
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1	about three o'clock or something, you know, later
2	afternoon. But how about the rest of the committee?
3	People have any times they can't do it?
4	MR. MARTINEZ: That'll be fine for me.
5	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. Hearing no
6	problems with that, let's try three o'clock on
7	Tuesday, November 19th at three o'clock.
8	MR. HERRERA: Will that be here on
9	site, sir?
10	DR. RITCHIE: And I yes. I am going
11	to presume that we'd like to do it in person if
12	possible and here at the OSI offices with the option
13	to do it by Zoom but obviously in person is
14	preferable. All right. Any comments?
15	So now onto the second item number 4,
16	other matters of the board. Any other new or other
17	business?
18	MR. CLARK: Mr. Chair, just to clarify,
19	that would be the location of the OSI offices in
20	Albuquerque for the 19th?
21	DR. RITCHIE: Thank you, Mr. Clark.
22	Yes. Where we are now.
23	MR. CLARK: Perfect.
24	DR. RITCHIE: Where we are now. Not
25	you, but where we are now.

1	Ms. Love? Yeah.
2	MS. LOVE: This is Kathy. For the
3	report, the recommendations to the OSI, I remember
4	last year we had a little bit of a glitch where we
5	didn't get it signed. And so let's can somebody
6	make sure that that goes to me and Chair Ritchie and
7	get signatures on it and then we can get it back to
8	Jennifer.
9	I assume, Jennifer, you'll be
10	submitting that. Is that right?
11	MS. ROMERO: Yes. That's correct. If
12	it's preferred, if you send me the draft, I can
13	circulate it to you both to be signed and DocuSigned
14	if that's acceptable, and then I can file it to the
15	record.
16	DR. RITCHIE: That's acceptable to me.
17	And doing this earlier this year, as we keep moving it
18	up
19	I'm sorry, Kathy, you're really
20	garbled.
21	MR. CLARK: Yeah. That really broke
22	up.
23	MS. LOVE: Yeah. I virtual
24	connectivity interruption keep me in the loop and
25	I'll sign what I need to sign.

1	DR. RITCHIE: I'm sorry. We lost most
2	of that. Something about what you used to sign when
3	you need to sign?
4	MS. LOVE: Sorry. I'm having audio
5	glitches, obviously.
6	DR. RITCHIE: It's good now.
7	MS. LOVE: I didn't hear any of what
8	Jennifer suggested, but I will sign whenever I get it.
9	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. Jennifer talked
10	about DocuSign.
11	MS. LOVE: Sure. That's fine.
12	DR. RITCHIE: Okay. Excellent. And
13	doing it this far ahead of time will certainly give us
14	plenty of time to get that signature in so it can be
15	submitted before the start of the legislature.
16	MS. LOVE: Well, and I'm talking about
17	the report on the recommendations, the surcharge
18	recommendations, which needs to be turned around
19	pretty quickly.
20	DR. RITCHIE: That too.
21	MR. AUTIO: And this is Nick Autio.
22	Mr. Chair and Ms. Love, I've just sent the revised
23	report documenting what we've discussed today to the
24	entire board.
25	It should I just replied all on the
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1	e-mail Ms. Love sent earlier, so everyone should
2	and I just checked, and it has been sent, so everyone
3	should have that in their inbox making the three
4	changes: changing the exhibit letters, eliminating
5	paragraph 29, and then revising paragraph B on page 5.
6	I made those changes.
7	It's in your inbox if anyone, you know,
8	has any revisions, I suppose let me know. But it
9	might be worthwhile everyone looking at it now so we
10	don't run into a rolling quorum issue if, you know,
11	there is an issue. It's in everyone's inbox.
12	MS. LOVE: May I suggest that we give a
13	deadline of Monday at five o'clock and if we don't
14	have any changes that then Jennifer knows she can go
15	ahead and finalize it. And Chair Ritchie and I will
16	sign and get it sent over to the OSI because I know
17	that they need some time to finalize their order.
18	DR. RITCHIE: That
19	MR. WARD: Can I just I'm just
20	I'm sounding like a nervous Nellie lawyer today. I
21	just want to remind everybody that on whatever when
22	you review, it's for the purpose of just making sure
23	that the intention of the motion to amend is reflected
24	and that there aren't any other additional substantive
25	changes to the

1	DR. RITCHIE: Didn't come through on			
2	mine.			
3	MR. WARD: Yeah. I'm not seeing it			
4	yet, Nick.			
5	DR. RITCHIE: Yeah. Neither have I.			
6	MS. LOVE: I've got it.			
7	MR. AUTIO: Yeah. It sent. That's all			
8	I can do, unfortunately, y'all. I don't know if it's			
9	a			
10	MS. ROBERTSON: It just came through.			
11	MR. AUTIO: Oh, good. It just came			
12	through, apparently.			
13	MR. VARGAS: And this is Ray. I agree			
14	with Kathy that let's just make close of business			
15	Monday the deadline.			
16	DR. RITCHIE: Yes. Wise. I think			
17	that's wise. And that gives us plenty of time before			
18	our deadlines.			
19	Okay. Any other matters? Okay.			
20	Hearing none, we've already done the next meeting			
21	date. So unless there's any other comments from the			
22	board or any of the guests, then we will stand			
23	adjourned.			
24	I want to thank everyone for their			
25	participation, their help.			

1	Ms. Romero, thank you for sticking
2	around, helping us out on this
3	MS. ROMERO: Of course.
4	DR. RITCHIE: with the OSI helping
5	out.
6	And I really thank the subcommittee
7	that came up with this report very much. Excellent
8	work once again, and I look forward to us finalizing
9	everything in early November and having a great
10	holiday. So we'll see everyone then. Thank you very
11	much.
12	MR. CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Ritchie.
13	Ms. Love, will you be sending out a
14	do you want to take the lead in sending out a notice
15	to the four of us who are going to do the subgroup for
16	the legislative report?
17	MS. LOVE: Yep. You got it.
18	MR. CLARK: Perfect. Thank you.
19	MS. LOVE: Thanks, everybody. Have a
20	good weekend.
21	MR. AUTIO: Thanks, everyone.
22	DR. RITCHIE: Thanks, everyone.
